I.BACKGROUND OF PARTIES

Homen Borgohain Nyash is a registered trust under the Society Registration Act XII of 1908 64(A) under the Indian Stamp Act Schedule with a vision of enriching social capital through creative endeavours. The potential objectives of the Nyash is (i) to propagate the vision, values and creative works of the great visionary and statesman (Shri Homen Borgohain) and to provide a platform in which one can feel, absorb and explore the intellect and human touch of this genius; (ii) to provide a safe, structured, caring and supportive environment for children to promote positive recreation; (iii) to evolve a library resource cum heritage centre support for preservation, access and application of literary and cultural resources and to promote culture and literature; (iv) to facilitate capacity building and sustainable community development.

Dhakuakhana College in the District of Lakhimpur, Assam (India) was established in 1966 by way of public donations. It envisages social transformation through higher education and community reach out programs. The History of the college is a reflection of keen and earnest desire of the people of Dhakuakhana where most of the inhabitants belong to the underprivileged sections of the society viz. the Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes and Other backward classes. The college is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh and recognized by the UGC under sections 2(f) and 12(B). The institution believes in establishing new courses, programmes to equip students in the changing scenario. The college organizes various community reach out programs through its various forums and collaborates with NGOs and civic forums.

II. Objectives of MoU:

One of the main objectives of higher education is to provide quality education to students and make them responsible citizens for the development of our society. This type of objective will be achieved if the institution with similar aims and objectives come closer to share information and resources with each other for better growth and transformation. In addition, as a part of social responsibility and commitment towards holistic development of students and society, it is the duty of the college to organise different community reach out programmes for the benefit of students and community. Collaborative activities will definitely help to identify the shortcomings, drawbacks and remedial measures. Thus, both the parties intend to collaborate with each other for the improvement of the students, community and society.

In particular, this MOU is intended to:

1. Explore ways to cooperate in education and creative works.
2. Explore the intellect of students in terms of culture and literature.
3. Organise programmes in the educational institutions for holistic development of students.
4. Exchange academic material and information.
5. Explore hidden talent of students by organising talent search competitions.
6. Facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities.
7. Create awareness among students and local communities to preserve the noble works of this genius.

III. Functionaries:

For proper implication MoU:

1. Each institution will constitute a committee to monitor and evaluate the functions of MoU.
2. A teacher of the institution will be designated as Liaison officer for monitoring the committee.
3. Both the Liaison officer will prepare an annual plan with the consultation of the head of the institutions.
4. The Liaison officer will have to submit a report annually to the head of the institutions and Head of the institutions will produce that report to the committee constituted for monitoring the function.

IV. Scope of the MoU:

1. Both institutions believe that close co-operation between the two would be a major benefit to the student community to enhance their academic skills and knowledge.
2. Both institutions will emphasise to promote culture and literature and facilitate capacity building and sustainable community development.
3. The interaction between two institutions will give platform to explore talents of the locality.


V. Period of MoU:

1. The tenure of the agreement is initially for three year from the date of commencement.
2. After satisfactory completion of three years, agreement may be extended to another period.
3. Both Parties may terminate this MoU within 30 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.

VI. Declaration:


The provisions cited in the above MoU are thoroughly discussed and reached at the consensus that both the institutions will follow the provisions and work effectively for successful implementation of the same.




