Feedback Analysis and Action Taken Report 2022-23

Feedback mechanism is an integral part of the academic process to evaluate any educational institution. In keeping with the prerequisite norms, Dhakuakhana College collects yearly feedback from all stakeholders to ameliorate the educational environment of the institution. NAAC Sub-Committee of Criterion-I of the institution designs, circulates and collects feedback from its stakeholders to monitor and evaluate its performance quality in terms of course curriculum and other related issues. Initially the college conducted the feedback mechanism through offline mode which was subsequently conducted through online mode. The feedback forms are collected from students, teachers, employer and alumni.

The college has a structured questionnaire for the stakeholder which addresses the following aspects under the feedback mechanism:

- The feedback form for students encompasses curriculum and its learning related issues. It addresses completion of course syllabi, communication skills of the teachers, contribution of the teachers towards enhancing problem solving ability of the students, facilities available for the students and co-operation of the administration.
- The feedback form for teachers encompasses issues like effectiveness of the course in present days' context, availability of sufficient classrooms and furniture, encouragement by the administration to carry out research and professional development activities and co-operation of the management with the faculty members.
- The feedback form for employer encompasses maintenance of cordial relation with the employer and staff, communication skill of the employee, contribution of the employee towards the development of the organization or institution, leadership quality of the employee and problem solving ability of the employee.
- The feedback form for alumni encompasses relevance of course in the career development, adequateness of the facilities provided by the college, observation regarding present status of the college, involvement of the alumni in the development process of the college and response of the administration towards solving their grievances.


After collection of feedback from the stakeholders it is analysed and sent to the Principal for the necessary actions.

A. Students Feedback Analysis Report 2022-23




B. Teacher Feedback Analysis Report 2022-23


C. Employer Feedback Analysis Report 2022-23



During the session 2022-23, a number of 70 employers submitted feedback through online mode (Google form). The graphical analysis of the report is cited below:




D. Alumni Feedback Analysis Report 2022-23
