### ABOUT DHAKUAKHANA COLLEGE

Dhakuakhana College in the District of Lakhimpur, Assam (India) was established in 1966 by way of public donations. It envisages social transformation through higher education and community reach out programs. The History of the college reflects keen and earnest desire of the people of Dhakuakhana where most of the inhabitants are belonging to the underprivileged sections of the society viz. the Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes, and Other backward classes. The college is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh and recognized by the UGC under sections 2(f) and 12(B).

The college was taken under Deficit system of Grant in Aid in 1975 and brought under the provincialized system by the Government of Assam in December 2005. It offers undergraduate courses in Science and Humanities having sixteen teaching departments. It also runs a Bio-Tech Hub and a study centre under the Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU). The permanent faculty strength of the college is forty-nine and that of non-teaching staff is twenty-four. The present students' enrollment is more than one thousand (including H.S Classes). It has a huge pool of bright alumni that includes a good numbers of university rank holders; quite a few of them occupying prominent position in public life. The 14.95acre big campus is having the requisite infrastructures- the administrative building, well equipped Library and classrooms, laboratories, playground, Boys and Girls Hostel, the canteen and other basic amenities.

The Institution believes in establishing new courses to equip students in the changing scenario and to meet the need of the local society. The college organizes various community reach out programs through its NSS Unit and other forums, collaborates NGOs and civic forums. It aims to introduce courses on entrepreneurship development and looking forward to partner with the industry and other entrepreneurs. The college is all set to celebrate its Golden Jubilee Year that starts on 25th July, 2015. Fifty numbers of multifaceted programs will be organized to mark the occasion.

### ABOUT CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Dhakuakhana College library is one the important libraries among the college library of Assam. The College Library, known as Central Library of Dhakuakhana College. The Central Library of Dhakuakhana College was started with the very inception of the college that is in the year 1966. At the initial level, the library started to delivery its services from a small room. After a while, the library was shifted to the administrative block. However, with the passage of time, the Central library was set up permanently contrasted in a separate RCC building (ground floor) where the library is presently accommodated. The library holds its goal to achieve the height as an ideal college library in this region as well as in Assam. The objective ahead is to serve the college community in the sphere of knowledge. In order to achieve the objectives, the library is continuously striving to adopt the best practices in all endeavors of its activities.

#### LIBRARY SERVICES

The college library provides all the basic services to its clientele in additions to some of the advanced services. The main services provided by the library are-

- 1. *Library Automation:* The Central Library is fully computerized and students can access the books through OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) located within the library. Moreover, all the transaction of the library is maintained through the Integrate Library Management System Software (ILMS) known as SOUL 2.0.
- 2. *Digital Library:* Central Library has built the Digital library system which acts as a platform for e-learning using the software D-Space 4.2. Students can browse the digitized documents like old questions papers, local history of the region and academic publication through the Digital Library systems of the college. Moreover, open access e-resources like books, journals, etc. also can be accessible.
- 3. *E-resources:* the library caters to the needs of the 21<sup>st</sup> century learning resources, basically the e-resources. Students can access 1,35,000+ e-books and 6000+ e-journals of NLIST programme of the INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network), Ahmedabad. The students can collect the username and password from the office of the librarian, and can access it from anywhere and at anytime
- 4. *Internet Access:* Students and staff can also access the internet the internet facility in the library
- 5. **Reprographic Service:** Students can avail the photocopying facility located in the library by paying a nominal fee.
- 6. *Library Orientation Programme:* Library Orientation Programme was conducted for the freshly enrolled students by providing basic information regarding the collections of the library, facilities/services, and the rules of the central library.




Figure 1: Display of user statistic of student (Source: Data according to SOUL 2.0 member log report)




Figure 2: Display of user statistic of teacher (Source: Data according to Teachers Reading Room Register)
